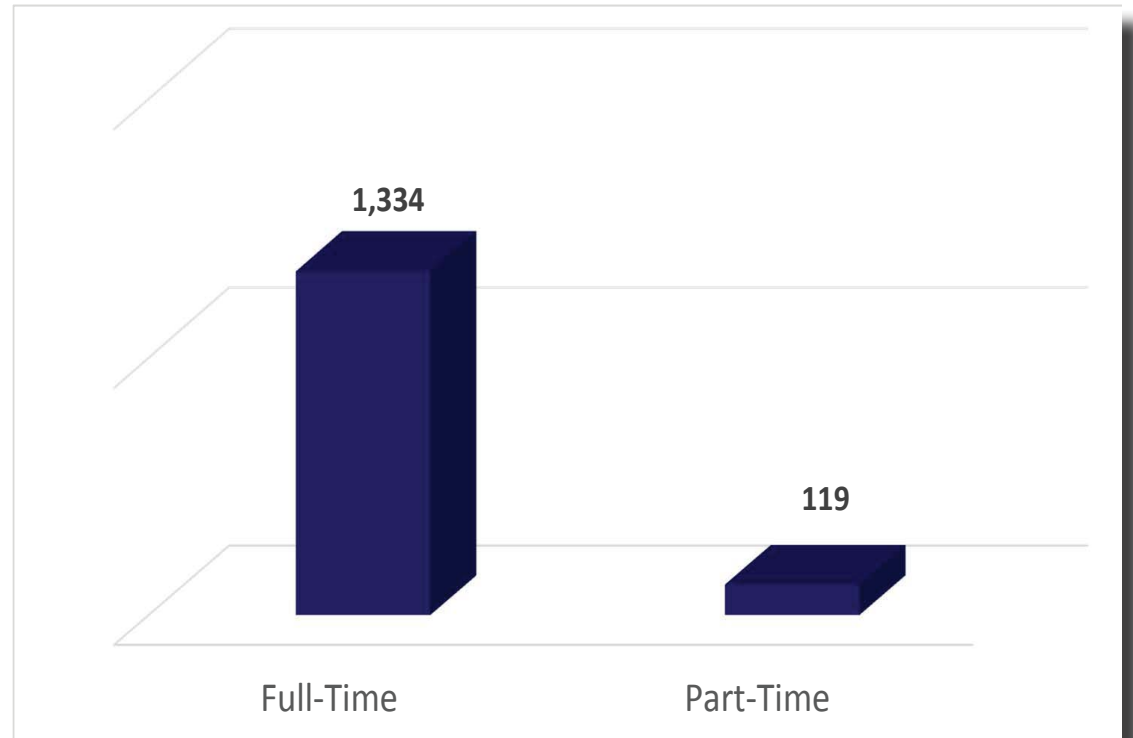

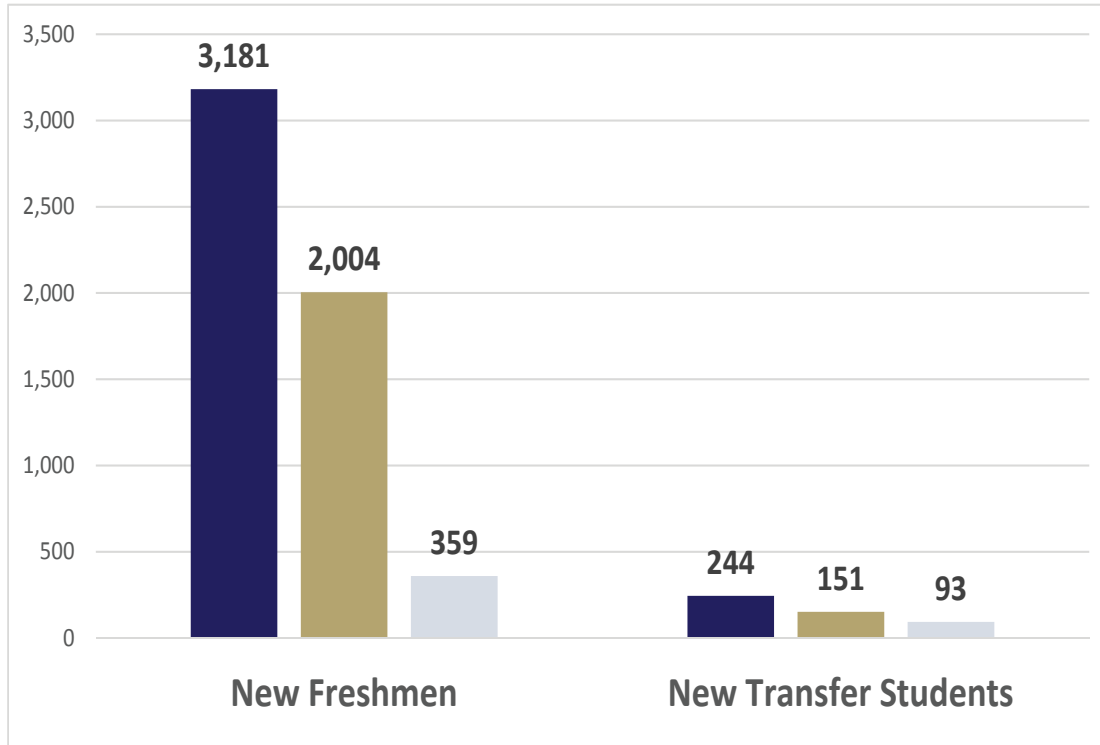

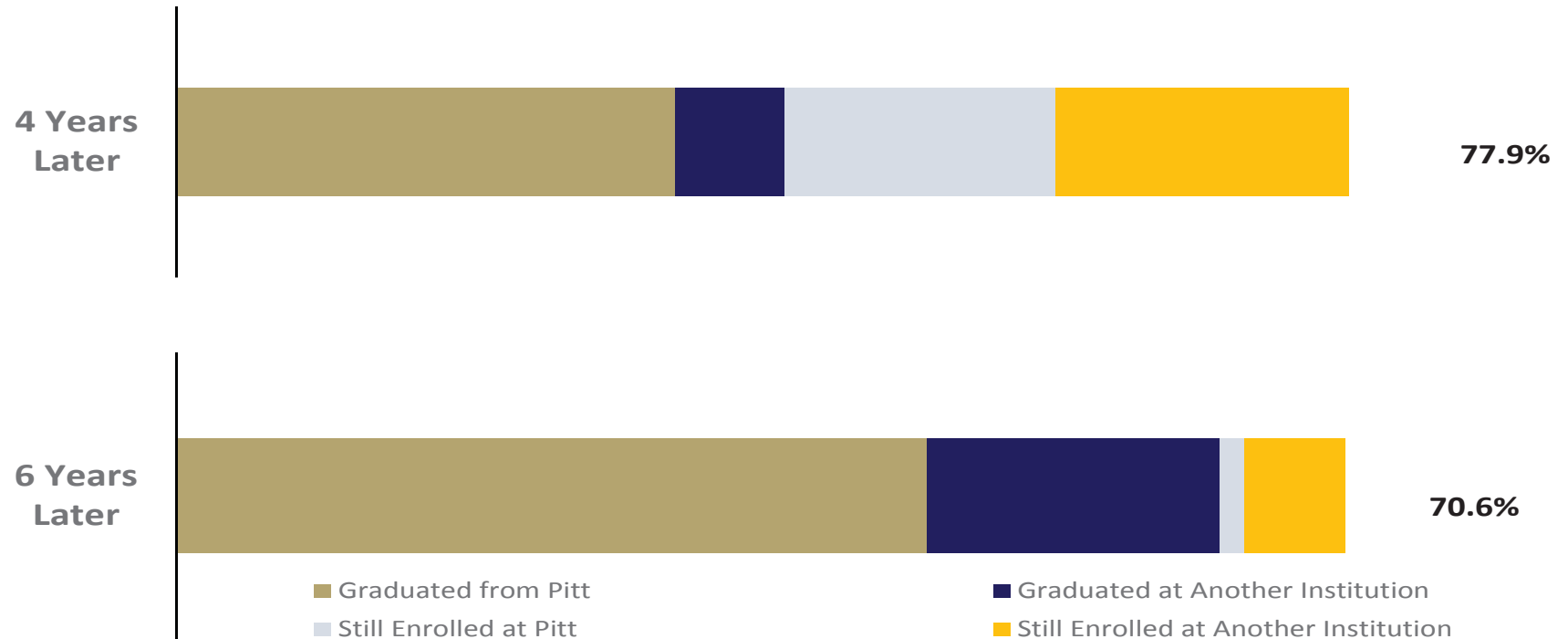

First-time full-time freshmen in Fall 2014 that returned for their second year (in Fall 2015): 74%



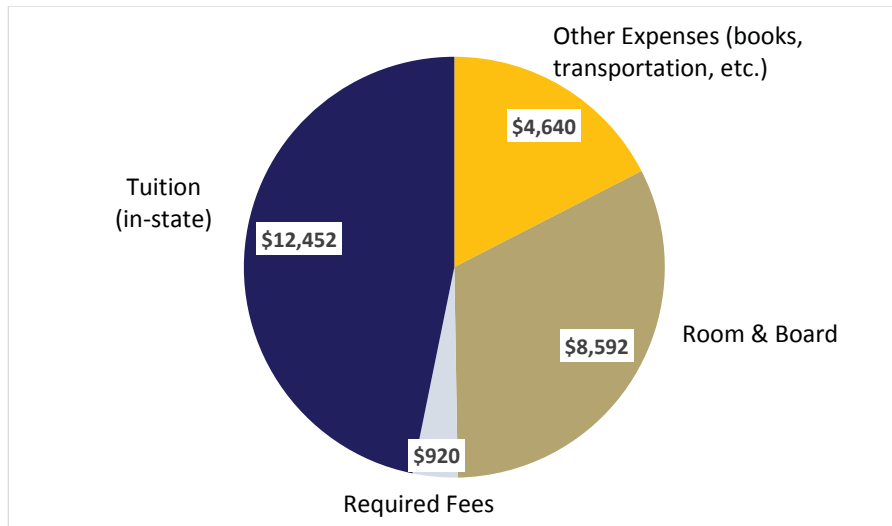

### Financial Aid Awarded to Undergraduates

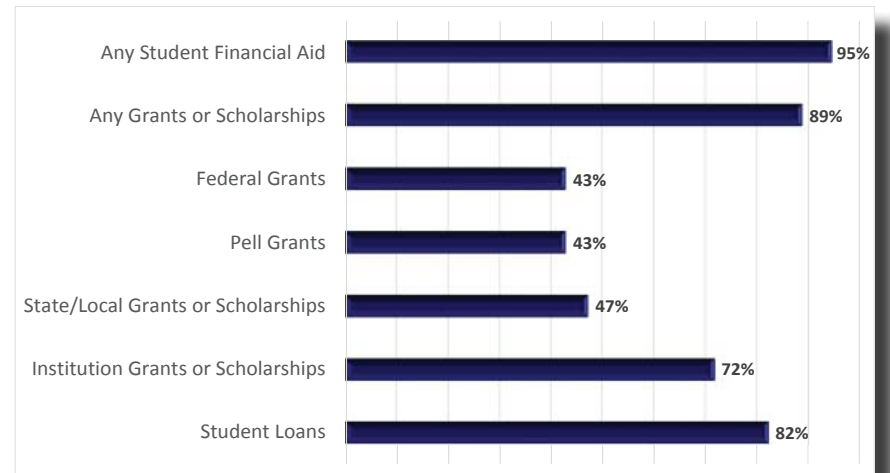
#### Annual Need-Based Scholarships & Grants

77% of 2014-15 full time undergraduates received need-based grants or scholarships; the average award for the year was \$8,650.
