When you are accepted to Pitt-Bradford, you may declare education as a major, but you are not considered a teacher education candidate until you have been officially admitted into a teacher certification program.

To qualify for the University of Pittsburgh at Bradford Teacher Certification Program as a post-baccalaureate candidate you must:

√ Already have a bachelor's degree

√ Complete the following courses with a grade of C- or above in each:

EDUC 0204 Introduction to Education
EDUC 0235 Instructional Design

√ Prepare a Career Goals Statement. This document must be computer-generated and should provide credible explanations for why you wish to become a teacher and what indications you have that this is an appropriate career for you. Give professional attention to the development and presentation of this information. In addition, your goal statement should include a theory that will guide you as an educator.

- √ Secure three (3) letters of recommendation. Letters may come from college faculty, high school teachers, employers, etc. – anyone who has knowledge of your strengths and how they might apply in the classroom. The letters must be signed. Letters may not come from friends and/or relatives. Letters may be submitted in the folder or directly to:

- Career Goals Statement**
- Letters of Recommendation (Three required. Include list of those submitting letters if they are being submitted directly to the program coordinator.)**

Submit the required components as one packet in a paper folder with three-hole fasteners and pockets to Mark Miller in 152 Swarts Hall.

Submission of application does not guarantee admission into the Teacher Education program. Your application will be reviewed by all Education Program faculty. An audit of your academic progress will also be completed. Your admission to the program will be dependent on the evaluation of your professional and academic dispositions.
